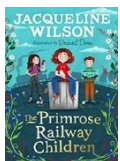

The Primrose Railway Children was inspired by E. Nesbit's novel The Railway Children. Jacqueline Wilson published The Primrose Railway Children in 2021.

Plot: Phoebe loves her dad more than anything. So when he leaves home without warning, she is confused and hurt. And that's made worse by the strangers with cameras who lurk outside the house and knock on the door with odd questions. When Mum takes Phoebe and her siblings out of school and relocates them to a dilapidated cottage in the middle of nowhere, her confusion grows. Until the cracks in Mum's story start to show...
