Full name: Neil Alden Armstrong

Date of birth: 5 August 1930

Hometown: Wapakoneta, Ohio, U.S.A.

Occupation: Astronaut, military pilot, professor

Died: 25 August 2012

Best known for: Being the first human to walk on the moon

Neil Armstrong was the first human to walk on the moon during the **NASA** (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) **Apollo 11 mission** on 20th July 1969. He completed the mission alongside co-pilots **Edwin E. "Buzz" Aldrin** and **Michael Collins**.

Key Vocabulary

Glossary/Key Vocabulary

Explore – to travel across or through in order to discover or search for something

Navigation – the act of setting a course for or controlling a ship or aircraft

Voyage - a long journey by air, land, sea, or outer space

Discovery – the act of discovering/finding something for the first time.

Toy - An object for a child to play with, typically a model or miniature replica of something

Electronic toy – A toy which uses electricity to function

Clockwork toy – A toy which uses clockwork technology to function

Past – Gone by in time. The time before the moment

Present – Existing or occurring now

Now – At the present time or moment

Then – At the time in question

Old – Made or built long ago

New – Produced recently or for the first time, not existing before

Museum - A building in which objects of historical, scientific, artistic, or cultural interest are stored and exhibited
