In the Annunciation God called Mary and she said 'Yes' to his call and why this makes Mary important for Christians. In Luke's story of the Annunciation, Angel Gabriel tells her she has been chosen by God.



'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And behold you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.'

Most High means God. **Mary says, 'yes' to God's plan. Christians believe Mary is someone who sets a good example.**

Elizabeth said, **'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!'**



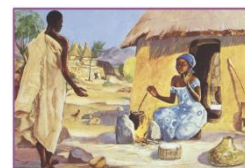
Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee.

Angels Good News Messengers Luke

The angels' message to the shepherds is found in the special Christian book, the Bible. It is in the Gospel of Luke.



Christians still sing words of the angels in a special prayer called the Gloria. It is often sung when they gather in church on Sunday. There are lots of different tunes for the Gloria.

The shepherds see the angels and know God is present. The angels sing of God's glory. Christians sing the song of the angels to remind them God is always with them.
