Key Vocabulary

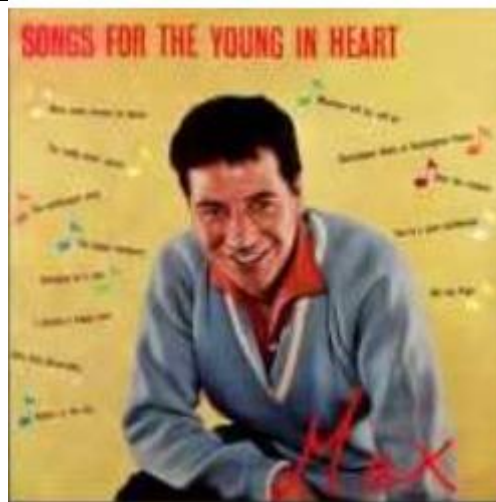
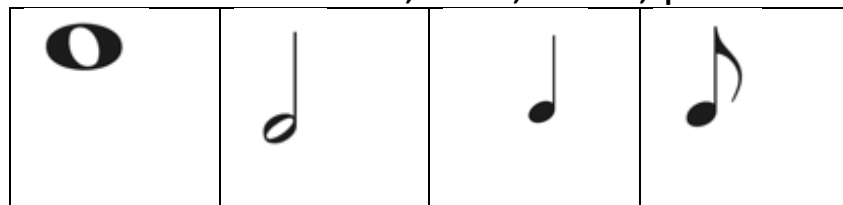
composer	a person who writes music, especially as a professional occupation
