Suffixes & Prefixes

A **prefix** is a group of letters that comes **before** a root word to alter its meaning.

A **suffix** is a group of letters that comes **after** a root word to change its meaning.

I can add prefixes and suffixes using -ing, -ed, -er and -est where no change is needed in the spelling of root words e.g. helping, helped, helper, eating, quicker, quickest
