Things I will be taught

Weeks One-Six

I know:

- How to sing songs with correct pitch.
- How to respond to visual directions when singing.
- How to respond to changes in dynamics when singing.
- Dynamics is how loud or quiet the music is.
- Tempo is how fast or slow the music is.
- Melody is the tune of the music.

Key facts to remember

- Mozart was a composer who wrote the piece of music called Rondo alla Turca
- Music is written with symbols called musical notes.

Key Vocabulary	
Composer	a person who writes music, especially as a professional occupation
Pitch	the perceived highness or lowness of sound

Key Knowledge: I recognise various untuned percussion instruments.



I know how to:

- Sing and perform songs regularly with increasing vocal control.
- Compose music in response to a non-musical stimulus (e.g. a storm, a car race, or a rocket launch).
- Listen to a range of music, recognising the work of different composers.
- Play rhythms on untuned percussion instruments Mark the beat of a listening piece (e.g. Bolero by Ravel) by tapping or clapping and recognising tempo as well as changes in tempo.

An untuned percussion instrument is one that is not pitched to any particular note. There are literally hundreds of untuned percussion instruments – anything you can hit, shake or scrape can be a percussion instrument.

An Austrian composer, widely recognized as one of the greatest composers in the history of Western music.

Musical Notes: semi-breve, minim, crotchet, quaver
