LI: I can talk about the story of Jesus appearing to his disciples.

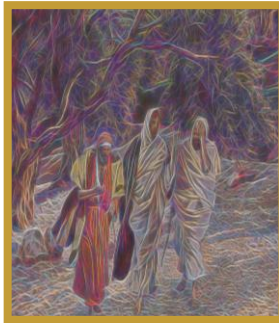
After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to the disciples and said, "Peace to you!" They were afraid, but he showed his hands and feet and ate fish to prove he was real. He explained the Scriptures and told them he would send power from heaven so they could be his witnesses .



Lesson Three and Four

LI: I can remember and sequence the events that happened between the Resurrection and Pentecost.

In (Luke 24:13–35), two of Jesus’ friends were walking to Emmaus when Jesus joined them, but they did not recognise him. He explained the Scriptures as they walked. At supper, when Jesus broke the bread, they recognised him and he disappeared. They said their hearts had burned and went to tell the other disciples.



Lesson Five and Six

LI : I can retell the story of the Conversion of Saul.

In (Acts 9:1–19), Saul was travelling to Damascus to hurt Christians when a bright light appeared and a voice said, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Saul asked, "Who are you, Lord?" and the voice replied, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." Saul became blind. In Damascus, Ananias healed him, and Saul regained his sight, was filled with the Holy Spirit, and was baptised.

LI: I know that Saint Luke wrote both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, and to consider the disciples’ feelings at the Ascension.

In (Acts 1:6–11), the disciples asked Jesus questions about God’s Kingdom. Jesus explained that only God the Father knows these things but promised that the Holy Spirit would come to give them power so they could be his witnesses nearby and "to the end of the earth." While he was speaking, Jesus was lifted up and a cloud took him out of their sight. Then two men in white robes (angels) appeared and told the disciples that Jesus had returned to heaven and would come back in the same way.

LI: I can sequence the events from the Lord’s Supper through to Pentecost.

At the Lord’s Supper, Jesus shared his last meal with his friends and asked them to remember him by sharing bread and wine. Then Jesus died on the cross, but on Easter he rose again. He appeared to his disciples, showed them his hands and feet, and promised they would receive power from heaven. Before going back to heaven, Jesus gave his disciples a special mission and promised to send the Holy Spirit. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came to help the disciples start their work.



LI: I know the idea of the fruits of the Holy Spirit is taken from one of Paul’s letters.

Paul wrote letters to help and encourage the followers of Jesus in different places. These letters, named after the communities he wrote to, are still read by Christians today. One letter was written to the people of Galatia, in modern-day Turkey, called Paul’s letter to the Galatians. In this letter, Paul talks about the fruits of the Holy Spirit, which are the good qualities that grow in people who follow Jesus.





Lesson Seven and Eight

LI: I know about the lives of some saints who showed the fruits of the Spirit.

Saint Francis gave up his money because he wanted to live simply and help people who were poor. He followed Jesus by loving God with his whole heart and not being distracted by things. As a saint, Francis showed the fruits of the Spirit by being kind, patient, and loving to everyone around him.



Lesson Nine and Ten

LI: I understand that Christians believe the Holy Spirit helps people to pray and to develop habits of good behaviour.

Christians believe that the Holy Spirit helps people to pray and feel close to God. When people find it hard to pray or know what to say, they can ask the Holy Spirit for help. The Holy Spirit also helps people make good choices, say sorry when they have done wrong, and grow good habits. Christians also believe the Apostles were filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, who was like a friend to them, giving them strength, courage, and guidance to go out and share the Good News.



Lesson Eleven and Twelve

LI: I can recognise and respond to symbols of the Holy Spirit (dove, fire and wind).

The Holy Spirit is shown using symbols like a dove, fire, and wind. The dove is a symbol of peace, fire shows power and energy, and wind shows how the Holy Spirit can move and change things. Fire is seen in the prayer "Come, Holy Spirit" and in the story of Pentecost, and children may also know hymns like "Holy Spirit of Fire" that use this image. Wind is used in the Pentecost story and in the Creation story, when the Spirit of God "hovered over the waters," and hymns like "Spirit of God in the clear running water" also link the Holy Spirit to wind and water.

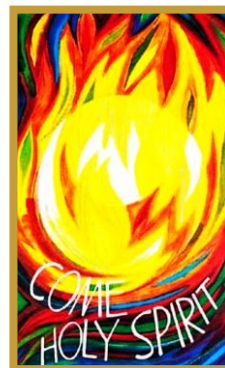
LI: I can reflect on how the fruits of the Holy Spirit can make a difference in their own and other people's lives.

All the fruits of the Holy Spirit are important, and different people may think some are more helpful than others. However, love is often seen as the most important because it helps all the other fruits grow. Without love, the other fruits would not be as strong. Which fruit of the Holy Spirit do you think is the most important?



LI: I can reflect on the Come, Holy Spirit prayer.

Christians have special traditional prayers, such as the Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, and the Sign of the Cross. These prayers help them to talk to God. The Glory Be and the Sign of the Cross are important because they mention the Holy Spirit. People from different faiths also have their own special prayers that are important to them. The prayer "Come Holy Spirit" shows the Holy Spirit as powerful, like fire, able to bring change and energy. The picture also shows a dove and flames, symbols of the Holy Spirit renewing the Earth.



LI: I can show what I have learned from this branch.

Important events in Jesus' life include the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, the Resurrection, Jesus appearing to the disciples, the Ascension, and Pentecost. Paul wrote letters to help Christians, and Saint Francis showed the fruits of the Holy Spirit, such as love, kindness, and peace. The Holy Spirit is shown through symbols like a dove, fire, and wind, and prayers like "Come, Holy Spirit," the Glory Be, and the Sign of the Cross ask for the Holy Spirit's help. The Holy Spirit helps Christians pray, make good choices, and share God's love with others.
