Key facts to remember

- Music is written on lines called a stave with dots called notes
- The placement of the notes on the stave indicate the pitch and duration of each sound
- Written music is called notation

Key Vocabulary

composer	A person who writes music, especially as a professional occupation.
chord	A group of (typically three or more) notes played together.
tempo	The speed of the music
dynamics	The volume of the music
notation	Written music using dots and symbols to indicate pitch, duration, dynamics and other musical elements
pitch	How high or low the sounds are
