		Loom	A tool or device used for weaving threads together to create fabric. It holds the threads in place while you weave	
		Pattern	A design or arrangement of shapes, colours, or threads that guides the weaving process and adds visual interest to the fabric	
		Thread	A long, thin strand of material, often made of cotton, wool, or synthetic fibres, used for weaving to create fabric	
		Weaving Technique	The specific method or style used to interlace threads, which can vary in complexity and design, such as plain weave or twill weave
