

<p>In English hair is a singular noun and in French "hair" is a plural noun (les cheveux).</p> <p>There are two words for "the" in French with singular nouns.</p> <p>These words are "le" and "la"</p> <p>There is only one word for "the" with French plural nouns and this is "les".</p>	<p>le papa - the dad</p> <p>le frère – the brother</p> <p>le bébé – the baby</p> <p>le grand- père – the granddad</p> <p>la maman - the mum</p> <p>la soeur – the sister</p> <p>la grand-mère- the grandma</p> <p>la famille– the family</p> <p>Je suis... – I am</p>
