	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Key Vocabulary and Glossary</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Keynote</b> A presentation software application developed by Apple that allows users to create professional-looking presentations.</li> <li>• <b>Shapes</b> Geometric figures like circles, squares, and triangles that can be used in digital art.</li> <li>• <b>Import</b> To bring in images or files from another source to use in your Keynote project.</li> <li>• <b>Manage</b> To organise and handle images or files effectively within Keynote.</li> <li>• <b>Animation</b> A tool that adds movement to objects in your presentation or project.</li> <li>• <b>Collaboration</b> Working together with others to create a shared digital project or presentation.</li> <li>• <b>Compile</b> To gather and combine different multimedia elements into a single project.</li> <li>• <b>Multimedia</b> A combination of different forms of content, such as text, images, audio, and video.</li> <li>• <b>Export</b> To save your project in a format that can be shared or viewed outside of Keynote.</li> <li>• <b>Share</b> To distribute your final project to classmates, friends, or online platforms.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Interesting Facts</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keynote was first released in 2003 as part of Apple's iWork productivity suite.</li> <li>• The term "multimedia" was first used in 1966 to refer to projects that combined text, images, and sound.</li> <li>• Animations can make presentations more engaging, and studies show that they can help improve learning retention.</li> </ul>
