

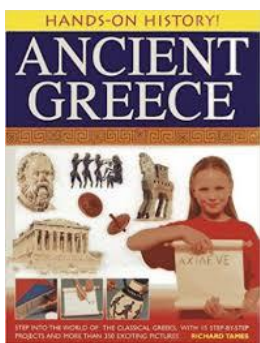

Use non-fiction books to research information about Ancient Greece. Use of example text to identify the features of an informative non-chronological text.



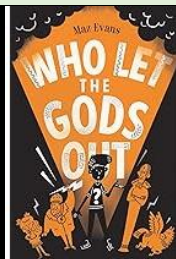
Final Outcome – Non-chronological report

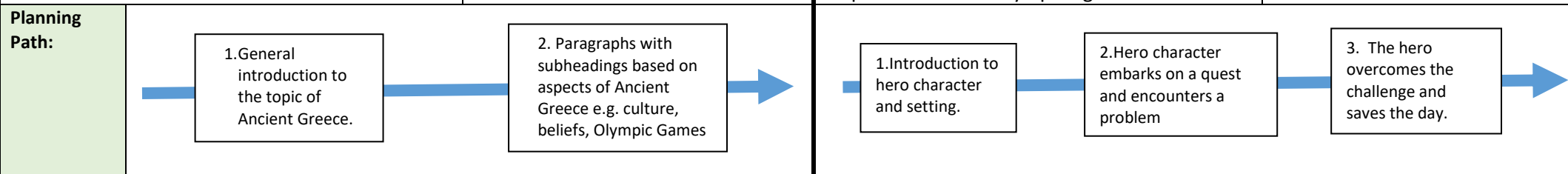
Final Outcome – Myth
