Things I will be taught

I know:

Week 1 - How to research some facts about the artist Michelle Reader and understand what it means to be sustainable by re-using products.

Week 2 - Michelle often takes her inspiration from the natural world, creating sculptures of plants and flowers using a wide range of waste materials

Week 3 - To discuss ideas and agree a recycling project to promote re-use, for example, creating a sculpture from recycled materials, e.g. a poppy display for remembrance

Week 3 - How to choose materials for the project for their shape, colour and texture, e.g. plastic bottles, coffee cups and aluminium cans -To draw a picture of my design, labelling recycled products, colour.

Week 4 & 5 – How to create a piece of artwork that contributes to the project, choosing and using appropriate tools and materials.
