• I can identify masculine , feminine and plural nouns. • I can pronounce unfamiliar words accurately using key sounds knowledge. • I can use some adjectives accurately with masc/fem nouns. • I can understand a story. • I can use a model to write a simple cartoon story. • I can use prepositions of place to say where things are.		<u>Grammar</u> • In French, when we use 'la' or 'le', we're referring to something specific. • For example, 'la cuisine' means 'the kitchen' (we know <i>exactly</i> which one we're talking about). • When we want to talk about something nonspecific, we use 'une' or 'un'. For instance, 'une cuisine' means 'a kitchen' (it could be <i>any</i> kitchen). • To switch between 'une/un' and 'le/la', follow this rule: • Change 'une' to 'la'. • Change 'un' to 'le'.
