Expense	The amount at which a product will sell for.
Cocoa	seeds from a tropical American evergreen tree.
Maya	An ancient civilisation from the Mexican and central American regions.
Wrapper	The packaging of chocolate wrappers used to advertise the product within.
Colour Marketing	The understanding of how colours, or combinations of colours, appeal to consumers.
Fair Trade	A method of sustainable farming in developing countries that allows for fair pricing and methods of production.
Consumer	A person who ultimately uses a product or service.

Interesting Facts

Chocolate was first consumed as a drink by the ancient Maya and Aztec civilisations around 1500 BC.

The cocoa tree, *Theobroma cacao*, translates to "food of the gods" in Greek.

Over 70 million tonnes of cocoa are produced around the world each year!

Only about 10% of chocolate produced is Fairtrade certified, meaning consumers can make a significant impact by choosing Fairtrade products.
