St Francis and the first Crib



Saint Francis wanted people to remember the story of Jesus' birth.



He had a good idea. He shared his idea with his friends. They all dressed up as people from the story.



They made the first Christmas



Today, people have cribs to remember the story of Jesus.

St Francis wanted to remind people that Christmas was about Jesus.

He thought of a way to remind people that Jesus' birth in a stable is at the heart of the story. The Son of God comes into the world with nothing except the love of his parents.

This is an Advent crown (also called a wreath).

Many Christians use an Advent crown to count the four Sundays before Christmas day. Each Sunday, they light a candle. The light gets brighter as Christmas day gets closer.

We can make An Advent Promise – to promise to say and do some kind things and to pray more often.
