	Carnivore	A carnivore is an animal that eats mostly meat, or the flesh of other animals.	
	Herbivore	An herbivore is an animal that mainly eats plants. Herbivores can range in size from small insects, like aphids, to large animals, like elephants.	
	Omnivore	An omnivore is an animal that eats both plants and meat. Omnivores can range in size from tiny insects to large creatures, like humans.	
Key Knowledge: A part or section of the human body, such as the arm, chest, nose, neck, or knee.		Key Knowledge: The five senses are the body's specialized functions that allow us to perceive the world around us	Key Knowledge: Some things eat meat or plants, others, like humans eat both.

Glossary/Key Vocabulary: Human body – The characteristics of people opposed to animals. Senses – How the body learns about the world- touch, taste, smell, hear, sight. Pet – A tamed animal kept for pleasure. Wild animal – An animal in their natural environment. Sorting – Arrange in separate groups according to types. Classifying – Group in categories according to shared features. Reptiles - Cold-blooded vertebrate animals that has dry, scaly skin. Birds - Warm-blooded egg-laying vertebrate animals that has wings and feathers. Mammals - Warm-blooded vertebrate animals that have hair or fur.
