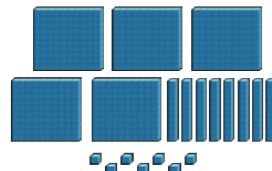

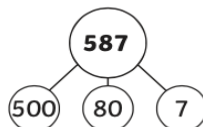

Key Vocabulary

Digit	A digit is a symbol of a single number. It can be 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9.
Ones	1's - A digit multiplied by 1.
Tens	10's – A digit multiplied by 10.
Hundreds	100's – a digit multiplied by 100.
Thousands	1,000's – a digit multiplied by 1,000.
Partition	Breaking numbers into smaller groups.
Place Value	The value of a digit depending on its place in a number.
