Key Vocabulary and Glossary

Digital Presentation - A visual way of presenting information using software, often involving slides, text, images, and animations.

- **Shape** A geometric figure such as a square, circle, or triangle that can be added to a digital presentation.
- Image A picture or visual representation that can enhance a digital presentation.
- **Text Formatting** The process of changing the appearance of text through font style, size, colour, and alignment.
- **Hyperlink** A digital link that connects one slide to another, or to external websites, allowing easy navigation.
- **Prototype** An early model of an app or software that demonstrates its design and functionality.
- **Keynote** An application for making presentations on Apple devices, allowing design and content management.
- Multimedia The integration of different types of content such as text, images, video, and audio in a
 presentation.
- Audience The group of people who will view or listen to the digital presentation.
- **Evaluation** The process of analysing and assessing the effectiveness of a piece of work to identify strengths and areas for improvement.

Interesting Facts

- The first digital presentation software was developed in the late 1980s and was called Harvard Graphics.
- Keynote is specifically designed to integrate seamlessly with other Apple products, making it a popular choice in schools and businesses.
- The average person remembers only 10% of what they hear but 65% of what they see. This is why using images and shapes in presentations is crucial.
- The concept of hyperlinks was created in the 1960s by Ted Nelson, paving the way for the internet as we know it today.
